Biography on Karla Armenti

Karla Armenti received her Doctorate of Science degree from the University of Massachusetts, Lowell, Massachusetts in occupational and environmental health policy. She is currently the Chief of Health Statistics for the New Hampshire Division of Public Health Services, managing the State Cancer Registry, the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System and the Environmental Public Health Tracking Program. The Health Statistics unit is responsible for providing custom data analysis and technical expertise for external and internal public health partners and for establishing policies and procedures for reporting public health data. Dr. Armenti is also adjunct faculty in the Masters of Public Health Program at the University of New Hampshire. In addition, she served for 4 years on the board of the NH Public Health Association, one of those years as President, and received the NH Public Health Association Presidential Service Award in April of 2007. She has also held leadership positions in the Occupational Health & Safety section of the American Public Health Association.
