Ludmilla Anderson is the New Hampshire Chronic Disease Epidemiologist and an Assistant Clinical Professor at the University of New Hampshire. She received her medical degree in General and Preventive Medicine at Charles University, Prague, Czech Republic. She received her Masters of Public Health in Epidemiology and Biostatistics at Boston University School of Public Health. In her current role, Dr. Anderson provides statistical and epidemiological support to several chronic disease prevention programs at the state public health department, and is an instructor of Epidemiology and Applied Epidemiology in the Masters of Public Health Program at the University of New Hampshire.
